## Stourbank Nurseries, Ham Lane, Wimborne

Thank you for your letter of the 19<sup>th</sup> September.

Many of the points raised in your letter have been made in the public examination and the Council has endeavoured to respond accordingly. I do not therefore attempt to reiterate what has already been said.

I disagree with your point that we have not engaged appropriately. We were made aware of the proposal as part of the Issues and Options consultation. We undertook an accompanied site visit and heard the points you wished to make. The proposal was subsequently included in the Options for Consideration document and various representations were made. These were considered by officers in the context of the evidence that you and others submitted to us, and the result was that the Council decided the land at Stourbank Nurseries should remain in the Green Belt.

The evidence that has been used throughout the process has been clearly explained and set out during the public examination. Examination document FD12 (Christchurch and East Dorset Employment Land Strategy) explains the employment evidence. Site selection and Green Belt assessment for employment sites have been undertaken as part of the following documents:
