
Dear Inspector Ord,

## Re. <u>Cultural Heritage Evidence to the Examination in Public of the</u> Bournemouth, Dorset & Poole Minerals Sites Plan 2018

I regret to inform you that I am no longer taking instruction from FRAME. As I have explained on several occasions I cannot offer advice or make a public statement or give evidence without being as thoroughly informed on the matters concerned as might reasonably be expected of a cultural heritage expert. Despite the procedural irregularities to date in the overall Mineral Sites Plan process I had agreed to attempt to continue conditionally in the expectation that I would be able to bring my evidence fully within the bounds of professional standards by the agreed date of the end of September 2018. As transmitted to me by FRAME via the MPA although not yet confirmed on the Examination website your decision to continue to grant extensions to the Mineral Planning Authority makes it impossible for me to fulfil my duties to an appropriate standard.

Since engagement in any form of tribunal automatically entrains public duties in respect of professional evidence I would respectfully request that you act upon the following advice: (a) you should ignore and discard any material written or verbal under my name put to you after the date of the 18<sup>th</sup> September 2018; and (b) I would be obliged if you would take great care with all documents in this case written by me prior to that date since I would warn you that they contain or may contain material fallacies or opinions based upon such fallacies albeit these documents written with due care and in all good faith at the time of submission.
