## Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 10. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 19**; **Figure 10**). There are no recorded designated or non-designated assets on the Site. There are however two non-designated assets within the research area. A findspot of a Roman coin (**Figure 10** no. **1**; MDO6824) is situated *c*. 150m to the south of the Site, recorded as having been found in a gravel pit. A Palaeolithic handaxe (**Figure 10** no. **2**; MDO6838) is also recorded to have been found *c*. 500m to the north-east of the Site. However, in the latter case, the findspot has been called into question in the HER entry as there were no known gravel pits in the area. If this is the case, this may have similar implications for the location of the Roman coin, so the location of neither of these can be regarded as reliable.

#### Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 11. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (Table 20; Figure 11). There are no recorded designated assets on the Site, but there are three non-designated assets. These consist of a post-medieval path (Figure 11 no. 28), a post-medieval drainage system (Figure 11 no. 29), and a Romano-British ditch (Figure 11 no. 37). There are no Scheduled Monuments within the research radius, but there are a total of 18 Listed buildings. The Grade I Listed St Michaels Church is situated in Stinsford c. 400m to the south-east of the Site; associated with it are a number of Grade II Listed tombs (Figure 11 nos. 8-17). The Grade II Listed Stinsford House stands adjacent along with a number of other Listed buildings and structures (Figure 11 nos. 4-7). A pair of early 19th century Grade II Listed cottages are situated c. 300m to the north-east of the Site (Figure 11 no. 3). These buildings are all associated with the Stinsford Conservation Area which covers an extensive area to the east of the Site, with its western boundary lying along the south-eastern side of the main road. The Grade II\* Listed park and garden of Kingston Maurwood house lies c. 250m to the east of the Site (Figure 11 no. 18). There is also a Grade II Listed milestone, probably of Roman date, closely adjacent to the north-eastern corner of the Site (Figure 11 no. 2). The Grade II Listed Grey's Bridge is situated c. 400m to the southwest of the Site (Figure 11 no. 1). There are also a total of 26 non-designated assets in the research radius. A large prehistoric ditch was identified c. 400m to the north-west of the Site (Figure 11 no. 23). Early -Middle Bronze Age material came from c. 200m to the north (Figure 11 no. 26). The Roman road from Dorchester lay along the route of the main road which borders the Site on its south side (Figure 11 no. 33), and there are Roman finds and features known both c. 500m away and closely adjacent to the Site on the south-west and north-east sides (Figure 11 nos. 32, 35 & 42), as well as on the Site. A probably Romano-British burial was discovered c. 200m to the north of the Site (Figure 11 no. 24). There is also a deserted medieval settlement c. 500m to the west (Figure 11 no. 30), whilst there are medieval features c. 250-500m to the north and situated immediately to the east (Figure 11 nos. 20, 22, 25 & 41). Post-medieval chalk pits are known c. 400m to the north and north-west and immediately north of the Site (Figure 11 nos. 19, 21 & 27). There are extensive remains of postmedieval water meadows, field boundaries and associated features, to the west, and immediately to the south on the opposite side of the main road (Figure 11 nos. 29, 31, 34, 36, 38 & 40). An 18<sup>th</sup> century milestone was positioned on the roadside immediately adjacent to the Site (Figure 11 no. 39). A WWII military camp was situated within the Kingston Maurwood grounds (Figure 11 no. 43).




Figure 12. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (Table 22; Figure 12). There are no recorded designated or non-designated assets on the Site. There is one Scheduled Monument, a Bronze Age barrow (Figure 12 no. 2), within the research area, c. 400m to the east of the Site, at the top of the ridge. This is associated with three further Scheduled Monuments which also lie on the higher ground, but are beyond the research buffer. These consist of a Bronze Age barrow (Figure 12 no. 1), c. 850m to the north-east; a Neolithic long barrow and two Bronze Age bowl barrows (Figure 12 no. 3) c. 900m to the south-east; and a bowl barrow (Figure 12 no. 4), just to the south of those, c. 1km from the Site boundary. The Grade II Listed Langbourne House (Figure 12 no. 5) lies just outside the research area c. 600m to the north-north-west of the Site. In addition, there are seven other non-designated assets of various dates within the research area (Figure 12 nos. 7-12). On the ridge to the east, c. 400m from the Site and adjacent to one of the Scheduled barrows, is an area of Iron Age settlement (Figure 12 no. 12). This is associated with an upstanding earthwork which is probably an Iron Age cross ridge dyke (Figure 12 no. 11). To the south of the Site, c. 450m from the research buffer, is the site of at least one post-medieval lime kiln, a chalk pit and a section of dismantled tramway (Figure 12 nos. 7-9). A post-medieval pumping station (Figure 12 no. 6) is located in the base of the valley, c. 500m to the west-south-west of the Site, and a reservoir (Figure 12 no. 10) is positioned at the top of the rise, c. 400m to the east.

#### Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 13. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 24**; **Figure 13**). There are no recorded designated assets on the Site, but there is one non-designated asset. This comprises modern gravel pits (**Figure 13** no. **7**). There are a total of five Scheduled Monuments within, or just beyond, the research radius (**Figure 13** nos. **1-5**). These are prehistoric field monuments. A Scheduled Bronze Age barrow is situated immediately adjacent to the southern boundary of the Site (**Figure 13** no. **1**), with another barrow beyond the research buffer to the south-east. There are also three segments of the prehistoric Battery Bank, (**Figure 13** nos. **2-4**) beyond the research boundary to the south-west and south-east of the Site, but associated with a non-designated segment of what is likely to be part of the same monument but within the research area, *c*. 400m to the south of the Site (**Figure 13** no. **23**). A further non-designated barrow is located *c*. 400m to the south-west of the Site (**Figure 13** no. **21**), and a probable late prehistoric track and enclosure are located *c*. 350-340m to the west (**Figure 13** nos. **15** & **16**). There are post-medieval water meadows, drainage features and a weir located from the north of the Site, along the north-eastern side down to the south-east (**Figure 13** nos. **8** & **10-13**). A number of post-medieval to modern tracks and boundaries are also present *c*. 450m to the south-east and to the north-west of the Site (**Figure 13** nos. **6**, **14-15** & **18**). Post-medieval to modern gravel extraction pits are present on all sides of the Site (**Figure 13** nos. **7**, **9**, **19**, **20** & **22**). To the south-west of the Site, and bordering on it, lies the WWII tank training area (**Figure 13** no. **17**).

# Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 14. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 26**; **Figure 14**). There are no recorded designated assets on the Site, but there is one non-designated asset, post-medieval ridge and furrow cultivation marks (**Figure 14** no. **12**). A Grade II Listed building, Madjestone Farm House, lies *c*. 300m to the south of the Site (**Figure 14** no. **9**). Although outside the research area, there are a total of seven Grade II Listed buildings *c*. 750m to the north of the Site within Wyke Conservation Area (**Figure 14** nos. **2-8** & **23**) whilst the Gillingham Conservation Area stretches away to the north-west (**Figure 14** no. **24**). To the north-east of the Site. *c*. 1km distant, the Scheduled Monument of King's Court Palace moated site (**Figure 14** no. **1**) is a significant component of the local medieval landscape. There are a further eight non-designated assets in the research area. These comprise a medieval green lane *c*. 400m to the south of the Site (**Figure 14** no. **10**), possibly medieval field systems *c*. 350m to the north-east of the Site (**Figure 14** no. **13**), and the post-medieval Madjeston Bridge (**Figure 14** no. **11**) immediately adjacent to the south-eastern corner of the Site. Three further areas of medieval settlement are situated *c*. 450m to the north-west of the Site (**Figure 14** nos. **14**, **15** & **18**). In a similar area there is Bronze Age (**Figure 14** no. **16**) and Romano-British (**Figure 1** no. **17**) occupation. Just beyond the research area to the north-west there is a findspot of a Neolithic axe, as well as Iron Age and further Romano-British settlement (**Figure 14** nos. **19-22**).




Figure 15. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 28**; **Figure 15**). There are no recorded designated or non-designated assets on the Site, and no Scheduled Monuments or Listed buildings within the research radius. There are two non-designated assets within the research area. These are the 18<sup>th</sup> century Old Barn Farm, formerly Woolsbridge Farm (**Figure 15** no. **1**), which is situated immediately adjacent to the northern boundary of the northern part of the Site, and the 19<sup>th</sup> century Wools Bridge (**Figure 15** no. **2**), *c*. 100m to the east of the eastern extent of the northern portion of the Site, on the Ringwood Road.

## Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 16. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (Table 29; Figure 16). There are no recorded designated or non-designated assets on the Site. There are two Scheduled Monuments just within the research radius, to the south of the Site. These comprise the location of the Late Saxon town and a medieval fortified house (Figure 16 nos. 1 & 2). There are also a total of 33 Grade II Listed buildings within the research radius, largely associated with the town of Shaftesbury. A group of five residential buildings is situated at Long Cross, c. 100-150m to the south-west of the Site (Figure 16 nos. 3-7). The Grade II Listed Payne Place and associated structures are situated c. 400m to the east of the Site boundary (Figure 16 nos. 12-15). In addition, there are a further 24 Grade II Listed buildings and structures of post-medieval date, situated to the south (Figure 16 nos. 16-35), largely associated with the three parts of the Shaftesbury Conservation Area (Figure 16 nos. 47-49), the northern edge of which borders the entirety of the southern boundary of the Site. There are a number of non-designated assets of various dates within the research area. A medieval deer park is situated within c. 100m of the south-west corner of the Site (Figure 16 no. 44). There are several medieval and post-medieval assets (Figure 16 nos. 36 & 38-40) associated with the core of the town. There are post-medieval to modern allotments c. 500m to the south-east of the Site (Figure 16 no. 37), c. 350m to the south-south-west (Figure 16 no. 41), and in two areas adjacent to the south-west corner of the Site (Figure 16 nos. 42 & 45). The post-medieval Long Cross Brickworks (Figure 16 no. 43) are c. 100m to the south-west of the Site and the Hawker's Hill Brickworks are situated immediately adjacent to the Site boundary to the north (Figure 16 no. 46).




Figure 17. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site




Figure 18. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 33**; **Figure 18**). There are no recorded designated or non-designated assets on the Site. There are no Scheduled Monuments or Listed buildings within the research area. There are however a total of 11 non-designated assets within the research area, and one just beyond it. A probable prehistoric enclosure (**Figure 18** no. **7**), seen on aerial photographs, is situated *c*. 200m to the south-west of the Site. Situated to the south are a number of mainly post-medieval assets which relate to the development of the outskirts of Blandford (**Figure 18** nos. **9-12**), with an undated feature also noted from aerial photography (**Figure 18** no. **8**) *c*. 300m to the south-west of the Site boundary. The post-medieval Cottage Farm (**Figure 18** no. **5**) is situated *c*. 300m to the east of the Site, with modern quarrying (**Figure 18** no. **6**) *c*. 250m to the west. The potential for medieval and earlier archaeology in this area is reflected in the presence of medieval lynchets *c*. 450m to the north-east of the Site (**Figure 18** nos. **3** & 4) and a probable prehistoric enclosure (**Figure 18** no. **1**) noted from aerial photography *c*. 450m north of the Site and a findspot of a spearhead (**Figure 18** no. **2**) *c*. 450m north-north-west of the Site.




Figure 19. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 34**; **Figure 19**). There are no recorded designated or non-designated assets on the Site. There are a total of five Scheduled Monuments within or just beyond the research radius, all of which comprise Bronze Age Barrows (**Figure 19** nos. **1-5**). These are situated to the west, south-west, south and south-east of the Site, between *c*. 200 and *c*. 600m from the edge of the area of search boundary. There is also the Grade II Listed Holy Cross Abbey at Stapehill *c*. 300m to the south of the edge of the area of search boundary (**Figure 19** no. **6**). In addition, there are four other non-designated assets of various dates within the research buffer. There are three areas of Mesolithic activity along the southern side of the area of search, *c*. 300-400m to the south, south-east and east of the Site (**Figure 19** nos. **7**, **9** & **10**).
